Taught Title I summer school English to students in grades 6-7 whose reading was below grade level. Over the course of this 21-day, morning-only session, 77% of the students far exceeded the superintendent's goal of 50K Accelerated Reader words per student, and all 13 students together read over 1,000,000 words.

Taught English, grade 9, and AP English Lit and Comp on a long-term substitute basis. I was asked to inspire 93 second-semester seniors who had substitutes all year and who were told they didn't have to take the AP exam to both take and pass the exam. 90% took the exam; 75% passed; and nearly half earned scores of 4 or higher, which is especially notable considering that only 80% had CST scores of Advanced.
