1. **Cavernous** – vast, deep, hollow and/or porous
2. **Monotonous** – lacking in variety, one-note
3. **Stoic** – expressionless, without showing emotion
4. **Pungent** – harshly smelly
5. **Contorted** – to twist in a violent manner as from struggle
6. **Devout** – displaying devotion, reverence or piety
7. **Inquisitive** – one who inquires or questions
8. **Partitioned** – act or process of dividing into parts; state of being divided
9. **Transfixed** – rendered motionless, fixed; pierced or impaled
10. **Succulent** – full of juice, moist, delicious
11. **Rites of passage** – coming of age rituals, milestones like a quinceañera

Discussion Q’s:

This song includes some high-level vocabulary from *Bless Me Última*, but does it also relate thematically? Does it include or involve any of the **themes** of the story? Remember that “theme” has a few meanings, including 1) the central message or main idea (in sentence form); 2) the topic (usually a single word); or 3) recurring motifs or symbols (like birds or boats or water or...) **So, does this song use only the vocabulary of the book, or does it also address any of its themes?**

How about the **tone** (author’s attitude)? Are there similarities, or is the tone of the book quite different from that of the song?

Extension Activity:

Add a verse to the song using another vocabulary word from *Bless Me Última*. For an extra challenge, write it in accordance with both the theme(s) and tone of the story.
