- libation – n) an intoxicating beverage that is drunk as part of a ceremony
- muse – n) any one of Zeus's nine goddess daughters that presides over art; n) creative genius; v) to think deeply
- nonchalant – adj) calm, unmoved, nonplussed
- pernicious – adj) harmful, wicked, deadly
- plague – n) trouble, affliction, widespread disease
- plunder – v) to rob, to steal, to fleece
- squander – v) to spend extravagantly, to waste
- subtle – adj) delicate, quietly clever, hard to see or otherwise fathom
